OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS CITY OF MORGAN CITY MAY 26, 2020

The Mayor and City Council of Morgan City, Louisiana, met at 6:00 pm (local time) in regular session, this date, in the Morgan City Municipal Auditorium Theater, 725 Myrtle Street, Morgan City, Louisiana.

There were present: Honorable Frank P. Grizzaffi, III Mayor; and Council Members Ron Bias, Steve Domangue, Tim Hymel, Mark Stephens and Louis J. Tamporello, Jr.

Absent: None

Also present were Mr. Marcus Folse, Chief Administrative Officer and Mr. Paul Landry, City Attorney.

The invocation was given by Pastor Ronnie Foret, Lighthouse Community Church.

There was no Positive Image recipient for the month of May.

The minutes of the March 24, 2020 meeting were submitted. There being no corrections, additions, or deletions, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Tamporello, seconded by Mr. Domangue, and voted unanimously in favor.

Mrs. Deborah Garber, Finance Director, submitted the following financial statement for the period ending April 30, 2020.

budget for the period ended April 30, 2020.

Attached is a summary that compares our actual revenues and expenses to our operational budget for our major funds subject to budgetary control for the period ending April 30, 2020. The following comments are related thereto:

General and Ancillary Funds: Revenues are over budget by \$48,000. Sales taxes in General Fund are over budget by \$57,900. Revenues is Lake End Park and Parkway are considerably under budget due to COVID-19. Operating expenses are below budget by \$316,300. The net loss, after transfers, of \$180,400 is a favorable variance of \$364,500 compared to the budget.

<u>Utility Fund</u>: Actual revenues are under budget by \$518,200, with operational expenses also under budget by \$740,600. The net income, after transfers, of \$183,530 creates a favorable variance this month of \$219,700.

<u>Sanitation and Sewer Fund</u>: The operating revenues are now \$33,875 over budget, with total operating expenses under budget by \$56,000. The net income, after transfers, of \$376,800 leaves a favorable variance this month of \$90,159.

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A motion to accept the financial statement was made by Hymel, seconded by Pastor Bias, and voted unanimously in favor.

In the Matter of the utility bill payment plan, Mayor Grizzaffi stated that there was currently about \$184,000 in arrears for customers who opted not to pay their bill while the City was not disconnecting for nonpayment. A majority of those 476 customers had made arrangements with the Utility Department to repay their bill. The customers would have until June 30, 2020 to get their account current with no late charges. Customers with a balance of \$300 or more past due will be given additional time to get their account current. This will be done on a case by case basis and arrangements would need to be made with the Utility Department. On July 1, 2020 the Utility Department would revert back to regular operations and customers who had not made arrangements could see service interruptions.

The next matter on the agenda was the surplus property from City Court; whereupon,
